# ARRESTS MADE IN AUGUST 2017

There were a total of **68** arrests made within the City of North College Hill in AUGUST 2017.

**45** of the arrests were recite arrests (the person arrested was not physically taken into custody but issued a citation and told to appear in court).

**23** of the arrests were physical arrests (the person was physically taken into custody).

Of the total arrests made within the month of AUGUST 2017, **19** were residents of North College Hill and **49** were non-residents.

## **IN AUGUST 2017**


There were a total of **51** auto accidents within the City of North College Hill in AUGUST 2017.

**0** - of these crashes involved injuries.

**28** - of the auto accidents were on public roadways.

**17** - of the auto accidents were on private property.

**6** - of the auto accidents were Hit/Skip related.



# TRAFFIC CITATIONS ISSUED

## IN AUGUST 2017

The North College Hill Mayor's Court had year-to-date receipts totaling \$81,391.16 as of AUGUST 2017.



There were a total of **112** traffic citations issued within the City of North College Hill in AUGUST 2017.

**76** of the citations were for moving offenses (OVI, Speeding, Fail to Obey a Stop Sign, etc.)

**8** of the citations were for non-moving offenses (Expired license plates, not wearing a seatbelt, etc.)

11 of the citations were for parking related offenses (Parked where prohibited by signs, etc.)

17 of the citations were written warnings (the person cited was not required to pay a fine or appear in court).



# VEHICLES TOWED OR IMPOUNDED IN AUGUST 2017

There were a total of 17 vehicles either towed or impounded within the City of North College Hill in AUGUST 2017. (These vehicles were towed or impounded at the request of the police department)



# FALSE ALARMS RECEIVED

## IN AUGUST 2017

There were a total of 24 false alarms received that required a response by the North College Hill Police Department in AUGUST 2017.

8 of these false alarms were to businesses.



16 of these false alarms were to residences.

209 Total false alarms have been received in 2017.



The following narratives are a small sampling of the various calls for service the North College Hill Police Department routinely receives.

## **CALLS FOR SERVICE**

### **Theft (2913.02)**

Officers were dispatched to the Tom's Drive Thru for a theft that had just occurred. The description given was a male black, 60's wearing all black and a light colored cap. That description was similar to that of another reported theft that occurred on 07/31/2017 at the same location. While enroute, PO Henn observed a subject matching the description given, walking east on W Galbraith Rd at Savannah Ave. He stopped that subject and recognized the subject. The suspect admitted to having been at the liquor store, but denied any trouble, stating "Oh, not



really." when asked. The suspect was transported back to the scene for positive identification. That identification was made and the suspect was advised he was under arrest for the theft.

PO Henn was able to speak with the reporter who stated the same subject from the theft yesterday came in on today's date, blocked the front door with a piece of wood, entered the store, and selected two bottles of alcohol. The subject concealed those items, and exited the store through the entry doors. The reporter approached the subject, at which time the subject took the bottles of alcohol and placed them

on the ground and walked away. With the incident from yesterday and the incident on today's date, the combined value of items that were taken was \$33.97. The items were recovered in both incidents in re-saleable condition.

The suspect was transported to our station for processing, issued a summons to appear in the Hamilton County Municipal Court, as well as a Trespass Notification, barring him from entering Tom's Drive Thru. He was then transported to his residence in Springfield Twp.

## **Telecommunications Harassment (2917.21)**

PO Shepherd was dispatched to speak to the complainant in regards to an harassment report. Upon arrival, she was met by the complainant, who stated that she had been receiving calls from several different unknown numbers that were threatening in nature. The complainant stated that the caller was an unknown male, and said he was going to "rape" her and throw "Molotov cocktails" through her windows. The complainant believes

the male is being paid by members of a family with which she has been having ongoing issues.



While PO Shepherd was on scene, she called one of the numbers the complainant said had been used to make threats to her. A male answered the phone and identified himself as Mark, but did not give a last name. PO Shepherd explained to him who she was and why she was calling. He stated to her that he called the complainant's phone because he had received a missed call from her number and was returning the call. He also stated he had no idea who the complainant was and that no one had asked him to call her.

PO Shepherd advised Mark not to call the complainant's phone again, and she advised the complainant that a report would be on file for the incident. She requested to speak to a supervisor and PO Shepherd let Lt. Petrocelli know that she would like a call from him.

## **Burglary (2911.12)**

Officers Six and Kilgore were dispatched to Catalpa Avenue for a burglary report. The victim stated she had just arrived home after being out all day. While walking up to the house she could see the rear window was broken out. She then quickly made her way to the house and saw the front and rear doors were also, now unlocked. She immediately called police.



Once on scene, Officers Six and Kilgore took opposite corners of the house to establish a perimeter until additional Officers could arrive on scene. The Hamilton County Sheriff Helicopter was also flying overhead. The helicopter pilot advised he could see the front and Officers could make entry if they wished. With this information, Officer Six and Kilgore made entry via the rear door. After clearing the house, the victim was brought in to see if anything was missing. She advised her two, 53" flat screen televisions were missing. She also was missing a money order for \$85 and a \$10 DVD player. The makes and models of the merchandise stolen were not known

at the time of the report. She did advise that both TV's were broke. One of them had been recently purchased at Rent-A-Center and she believed was covered under their insurance.

Officer Six checked the areas where the TV's were for finger prints. One TV was on the ground and one was in the bedroom.

Neither TV appeared to have been in a location that would allow Officers to obtain prints.

## **Disorderly Conduct (2917.11)**

Officers Six and Kilgore were dispatched to Emerson Avenue for a neighbor trouble complaint. Once on scene, a second neighbor advised he observe a male subject leave a residence on Emerson Avenue. The subject crosses the street and was allegedly seen urinating on the driveway of his neighbor's house. This is witnessed by a 17 year old female, who was on the porch as well. Officers interviewed the girl, and she stated she did not actually see the act, however, she did see the male party zip up his fly when done.

The subject then left the scene on foot. The subject was identified and located. Officers contacted the suspect's mother, and advised her to have her son turn himself in. The suspect arrived at NCHPD a short time later. The suspect stated he poured out a beverage there, but did not urinate. He also stated his fly was broken and not able to be zipped up. He was cited for disorderly conduct.

### **Theft (2913.02)**

PO Henn was called to Kroger for a theft report. Upon arrival, he was met by a store manager, who states two male whites entered the store, went to the baby formula aisle, and selected several large cans of baby formula. The subjects then concealed the merchandise on their person and exited the store, passing all points of sale, without paying for the merchandise. According to the reporter, another customer who observed the subjects identified one of the males and provided a name. The reporter will attempt to obtain video of the offense, and officers will follow up after that video is obtained.



### **Aggravated Robbery (2911.01)**

On 8/30/17, officers were dispatched for a street robbery that just occurred. Upon arrival PO Miller was greeted by the victim. The victim was very intoxicated at the time of this report and had just come from an unknown bar on Colerain Ave.

The victim stated that she was walking east on Galbraith Rd when two young (teens to 20's) male blacks walked out of the Apartment Complex. She stated that one subject passed her walking the opposite direction and said, "What's up?" As she turned around to acknowledge him, the other subject grabbed her by the shoulders and throw her to the ground. The subject that throw her to the ground pulled out a

handgun and pointed it at her while the other subject said, "You know what this is about. Give me what you got". She told them she didn't have anything and handed them her purse. With the purse in hand she said the subjects ran back into Apartment Complex.

The victim stated that her purse contained no currency but it did have

her identification, bank card (Cinfed), 2 credit cards (Capitol One & US Bank), and her cell phone. No cell phone GPS track was performed due to Ms. Davis not knowing the number.

She described the subjects as follows:

Suspect#1 (Gunman): M/B late teens to 20's wearing ball cap and black sweatshirt possibly with red on it.

Suspect#2: M/B late teens to 20's wearing all gray sweat suit.

After the suspects fled, the victim walked to a house on W. Galbraith, where she saw a woman sitting on the porch and asked her to call 911. PO Miller spoke to the resident and asked if she had seen the victim walking the street. She stated that she was reading her book and wasn't paying any attention. He asked if she saw or heard anything reference to the robbery. She stated that she did

hear a female yell once but didn't look to see where it came from.

PO Miller set up a perimeter and had a K9 unit (8E43) respond for a track. The K9 attempted to initiate a track but was unable to pick up any kind of a scent.

The victim was transported to a friend's apartment located on Cedar Ave and provided a business card and told to contact the PD with contact information since her phone was taken.
