# ARRESTS MADE IN JULY 2017

There were a total of 68 arrests made within the City of North College Hill in JULY 2017.

30 of the arrests were recite arrests (the person arrested was not physically taken into custody but issued a citation and told to appear in court).

38 of the arrests were physical arrests (the person was physically taken into custody).

Of the total arrests made within the month of JULY 2017, 26 were residents of North College Hill and 42 were non-residents.

# VEHICLE CRASHES REPORTED IN JULY 2017


There were a total of 30 auto accidents within the City of North College Hill in JULY 2017.

4 - of these crashes involved injuries.

13 - of the auto accidents were on public roadways.

7 - of the auto accidents were on private property.

6 - of the auto accidents were Hit/Skip related.



# TRAFFIC CITATIONS ISSUED

## IN JULY 2017

The North College Hill Mayor's Court had year-to-date receipts totaling \$69,322.16 as of JULY 2017.



There were a total of **109** traffic citations issued within the City of North College Hill in JUNE 2017.

**56** of the citations were for moving offenses (OVI, Speeding, Fail to Obey a Stop Sign, etc.)

**26** of the citations were for non-moving offenses (Expired license plates, not wearing a seatbelt, etc.)

9 of the citations were for parking related offenses (Parked where prohibited by signs, etc.)

18 of the citations were written warnings (the person cited was not required to pay a fine or appear in court).



# VEHICLES TOWED OR IMPOUNDED IN JULY 2017

There were a total of 14 vehicles either towed or impounded within the City of North College Hill in JULY 2017. (These vehicles were towed or impounded at the request of the police department)



# FALSE ALARMS RECEIVED IN JULY 2017

There were a total of 26 false alarms received that required a response by the North College Hill Police Department in JULY 2017.

11 of these false alarms were to businesses.



15 of these false alarms were to residences.

185 Total false alarms have been received in 2017.



The following narratives are a small sampling of the various calls for service the North College Hill Police Department routinely receives.

## **CALLS FOR SERVICE**

### **Aggravated Burglary** **(2911.11)**

Officers were dispatched to the Emerson Ave. for a burglary in progress. While responding we were updated that two male blacks with guns were seen inside the residence by the complainant, who was outside waiting for the police. It was unknown if the suspects were still inside. PO Miller had a police K9 respond to the scene and requested additional units to assist.

Upon arrival, PO Miller found the complainant in the front yard. He stated that he was in the basement of the house, his

bedroom area, when he heard footsteps on the floor above him. Thinking it was his cousin, who resides with him, he yelled upstairs. Not hearing an answer he walked up stairs to the main floor and towards his cousin's bedroom and was confronted by 2 armed men. The complainant said he was in the hallway and they were in the front bedroom.



The suspects were described as male blacks in their late teens or early 20's. Both were wearing hoodies, one black one dark gray. Both were armed with black handguns and were between 5'7" and 5'10" in height. One

suspect had a light skin complexion while the other suspect had a medium complexion.

Once the complainant and the suspects saw each other, the suspects pointed their guns at the complainant while he darted towards the front door to escape. Suspects went after the complainant in the house and attempted to stop his escape. He said they stated, "Get back in here" as he was exiting the front door and grabbed and tore his shirt.

The complainant never saw the suspects exit the house and when we arrived the rear door was open. We entered and checked the house for possible suspects. With the house secured, 9E43 (SPTP Carter) deployed his K9 in the backyard and was able to track through the rear yards on Emerson to Cordova and Simpson where the track ended.

It is unknown how the suspects entered the residence. No forced entry was found and the complainant stated he had to unlock the front door when he exited the house. He also stated the rear was closed when he came

upstairs from the basement. The complainant thought both doors were locked.

The only property in the residence that was disturbed was 4-5 ball caps on the floor in the living room near the front door. The complainant's cousin said they were originally in his bedroom. No other property appeared to be disturbed and nothing was reported missing at the time of this report. The scene was photographed and the front and rear door was processed for prints.

## **Passing Bad Checks** **(2913.11)**

Huntington Bank called and advised there was a subject in the bank that was attempting to cash a fraudulent check. The caller stated she had talked to the account holder and confirmed that the check was not given to the suspect. The victim responded to the bank earlier and advised there were 3 checks missing from her checkbook. The victim did not however, report the stolen checks to the Police.

On arrival, PO's Ryan Lasonczyk spoke to the suspect and she stated her mother had given her



this check and has given her several checks in the past. PO Lasonczyk spoke to the teller and got a phone number for the victim. He called the victim and she stated she had not given her daughter a check, nor did she give her permission to cash a check from her account. PO Lasonczyk advised her that should she wish to continue with charges, he would need her to come to the PD to fill out an Affidavit, and she would also need to come to court to testify. She stated she would.

PO Lasonczyk transported the suspect to the PD and completed the paperwork for Passing Bad Checks. While the paperwork was being completed, the victim did come to the PD and filed an Affidavit. Upon completion of the paperwork, the suspect was transported to the Justice Center by PO Ryan.

### **Identity Theft (2913.49)**

The victim came to our station to report an unknown person or persons accessed her personal information by unknown means, and she has found unauthorized activity on her credit report. The victim states she was attempting to secure a loan, and found an unauthorized inquiry on her credit

report. When the victim looked into the inquiry further, she found an account had been opened using her personal information. That account was then closed after the reporting entity learned the information used was fraudulent. The victim is now attempting to have the inquiry removed from her credit report.

The victim was advised a report would be on file with our department to document the incident as well as the procedure to follow for obtaining a copy of that report.

### **Carrying Concealed Weapons (2923.12)**

Officers were dispatched to Fricker's for a report of a male subject with a firearm in the bar. The manager of the bar stated that he observed the subject order a beer, then exit the bar to the outside patio area. He then removed a large black handgun from the front of his pants, removed then replaced the magazine, and then worked the slide on the weapon. The subject then returned the gun to his pants. Mr. Benedict then called police. Upon arrival officers responded to the patio area. Lt.



Petrocelli observed the subject through the doors of the patio, standing there drinking a beer. Lt. Petrocelli ordered the suspect to place his hands where he could see them, and grabbed his arm. Lt Petrocelli asked him where the gun was. As Lt. Petrocelli cuffed the suspect, he stated that he had the gun in pants. Lt. Petrocelli found a Hi-point .40 caliber, loaded with one in the chamber and two extra magazines.

When asked, the subject stated that he the gun for home protection and was just loading it up. The subject was placed into custody processed for Carrying Concealed Weapons, loaded and ready at hand, in a D Liquor Permit holder establishment, and using weapons in while intoxicated. He was transported to the Justice Center without further incident.

### **Theft (2913.02)**

Officers were dispatched to Kroger for a theft that had just occurred. While enroute, officers were given the update of a suspect description, M/B, wearing green sweat pants and a white T-shirt, last seen running toward the Perkins on Hamilton Ave. Upon arrival, PO Henn located the

victim who stated she had placed an ad on Face Book Market to sell an iPhone 6S for \$250.00. The suspect responded to the ad, and the two parties arranged a meeting at the Kroger in NCH for the purchase. The victim went on to say when she met the suspect at the Kroger, the suspect asked to see the phone, at which time the suspect immediately grabbed the phone from the victim and ran. The victim stated the suspect ran toward Gardenwood Ln, toward the rear of the Kroger property. Officers were in that area, and began a search for the



suspect. PO Morris spoke with the postal worker in the area, and he advised the suspect, along with another unknown male black wearing no shirt, and dark

sweat shorts was last seen running south on Northridge Dr. from the area. The postal worker stated the subject in the green sweat pants was carrying what appeared to be a white cell phone.

The victim forwarded a screen shot of the suspect's Face Book page, with the suspect's photo. An RCIC/JUVIWEB search found a photo of the suspect, which matched the Face Book photos, and the victim

made a positive identification of the suspect.

A search of the area was done, but officers were unable to locate the suspect. A visit was made to the suspect's residence. There was no answer at the residence. The victim was advised a report would be on file with our department. She was further advised charges will be filed on her behalf against the suspect, and she will be notified upon the suspect's arrest for the pending court date.



console of the vehicle was open, with several contents scattered across the front of the vehicle. The complainant then stated the she checked her other vehicle, the 2008 Nissan Sentra, and observed that the glove box was open, and several items were scattered inside the vehicle. The complainant advised

that the Nissan was primarily driven by her daughter. The daughter stated that she parked the Nissan in the driveway at approximately 7:30 pm on 7/20/17. She also stated that the front driver side door was not locked upon entering the residence.

## **Criminal Damaging** **(2909.06)**

On 7/21/17 at 5:59 am, PO Smith was dispatched to Hamilton Ave to investigate criminal damaging to motor vehicles. Upon arrival, he made contact with the complainant. The complainant stated that two of her vehicle, a 2012 Buick Enclave, and 2008 Nissan Sentra, were tampered with while parked in the driveway.

The complainant stated that the Buick was parked at approximately 4:30 pm on 7/20/17 with all doors to the vehicle locked. The complainant then stated that upon approaching the vehicle, she observed the center

Both the complainant and her daughter stated that no items appeared to be removed from the vehicles.

## **Menacing (2903.22)**

PO Henn was called to Bising Ave. for a menacing report. Upon arrival, he was met by the victim who states her estranged sister has been making threats to harm her via social media and text messaging. According to the victim, the sister does suffer from mental illness. The victim states their mother was recently diagnosed with cancer, and she believes this may

have caused the sister to experience additional problems. The threats made were stating she wished the victim was dead, as well as threats to cause the victim bodily harm. The sister also made threats against another family member who resides in Columbus, Ohio.

The victim was advised of the process to seek a Civil Protection order against the sister, and should anyone come to her residence unexpectedly, or if it is someone she doesn't know, she should contact police. She was further advised a report would be on file with our department to document the incident as well as the procedure to follow for obtaining a copy of that report.

### **Theft From Vehicle** **(2913.02)**

The complainant responded to the North College Hill PD to report that subject(s) unknown did enter her unlocked vehicle and removed approximately \$3.00 in change without consent to do so. She stated she parked the vehicle in the driveway behind her house at 1400 hours on July 20, 2017 and when she went into her vehicle at 1400 hours on today's date, she noticed there was some change

on the seat and papers from the glove compartment in the passenger's compartment. She stated she normally locks her vehicle, but she left it unlocked last night.


### **Criminal Mischief (2909.07)**

On July 22, 2017 at 2:20 am, officers received a cell call reference to observing 3 male black youths walking on Carpenter pulling on car door handles. The caller stated that they entered a car parked on Carpenter but he yelled at them and they fled towards Simpson. Officers responded to the area and were unable to locate the subjects. The vehicle owner was located and at the time of this report didn't find anything to be missing from the vehicle.

### **Robbery (2911.02)**

Officers were flagged down by a Dominos employee, who stated he was just robbed at gunpoint on Columbine Ct. PO Cole had several units respond to the location to secure the scene.

The victim stated he was on his last delivery and was enroute to the listed location. He stated he contacted the caller to get a location



of the subject in the complex. The caller stated he would come out to meet him. The victim stated the price for the pizza and said the suspects were acting nervous. He stated he started to put the pizza boxes back in the vehicle and a male black 6 foot tall with gray jumpsuit and black mask pointed a gun (Boxy look possibly a 45 Cal.) at his head and told him to sit down.

The victim sat down and two other male blacks (Light skin, bald, white shirt with green shirt over mouth/Male

black, dark skin, black shirt, and short dreads) went through his side pockets. They took roughly a hundred dollars and a Samsung Galaxy Edge cell phone. He stated they ran east bound behind the apartments. Officers gathered all of victim's information so he could leave.
