# **ARRESTS MADE IN FEBUARY 2018**

There were a total of **79** arrests made within the City of North College Hill in FEBRUARY 2018.

**39** of the arrests were recite arrests (the person arrested was not physically taken into custody but issued a citation and told to appear in court).

**40** of the arrests were physical arrests (the person was physically taken into custody).

Of the total arrests made within the month of FEBUARY 2018, **27** were residents of North College Hill and **52** were non-residents.

# VEHICLE CRASHES REPORTED IN FEBRUARY 2018


There were a total of 29 auto accidents within the City of North College Hill in FEBRUARY 2018.

4 - of these crashes involved injuries.

17 - of the auto accidents were on public roadways.

3 - of the auto accidents were on private property.

5 - of the auto accidents were Hit/Skip related.



# TRAFFIC CITATIONS ISSUED

## IN FEBRUARY 2018

The North College Hill Mayor's Court had year-to-date receipts totaling \$25,564.00 as of FEBRUARY 2018.



There were a total of **153** traffic citations issued within the City of North College Hill in FEBRUARY 2018.

**79** of the citations were for moving offenses (OVI, Speeding, Fail to Obey a Stop Sign, etc.)

**21** of the citations were for non-moving offenses (Expired license plates, not wearing a seatbelt, etc.)

20 of the citations were for parking related offenses (Parked where prohibited by signs, etc.)

33 of the citations were written warnings (the person cited was not required to pay a fine or appear in court).



# VEHICLES TOWED OR IMPOUNDED IN FEBRUARY 2018

There were a total of 18 vehicles either towed or impounded within the City of North College Hill in FEBRUARY 2018. (These vehicles were towed or impounded at the request of the police department)



# FALSE ALARMS RECEIVED IN FEBRUARY 2018

There were a total of 27 false alarms received that required a response by the North College Hill Police Department in FEBRUARY 2018.

11 of these false alarms were to businesses.



16 of these false alarms were to residences.

44 Total false alarms have been received in 2018.



The following narratives are a small sampling of the various calls for service the North College Hill Police Department routinely receives.

## **CALLS FOR SERVICE**

### **Criminal Simulation** **(2913.32)**

PO Shepherd was dispatched to Family Dollar for a report of a theft in progress. Upon arrival, she was met by store manager, who stated an unknown male entered the store and attempted to buy a gift card with \$300.00 of counterfeit US currency. The male handed the manager two \$50 bills and two \$100.00 bills. Upon checking the bills, the manager noticed they were counterfeit, and then the male ran



from the store north towards Penn Station. The male was described as a younger black male, wearing all black with a "box" haircut. The male did not leave from the store with any merchandise or gift cards, but left the counterfeit bills at the store. PO Shepherd asked the manager if she had access to the security cameras and she replied no.

### **Criminal Damaging** **(2909.06)**

PO Henn was called for a property damage report. Upon arrival, he was met by the victim who states, sometime between 2/4/18 and 2/5/18, an unknown person or

persons caused damage to his 2015 Hyundai Sonata, while that vehicle was parked in the driveway of his residence. The driver side rear tire does have what appears to be a cut or puncture on the outer sidewall of the tire. The victim states he has had some problems from unknown subjects due to his wife's political views, and political signs that are posted in the victim's yard; however he did not observe anyone near his vehicle and has no idea who specifically may have caused the damage.



is located on the south side of the residence. She states when she went to look at the security light she found a glass square in the side door broken out. She states the light bulb in the security light was unscrewed so that it would no longer illuminate, concealing the person while breaking out the window.

The victim believes the suspect is possibly the father of her child, as he was calling the victim all day. She states that they have been broken up for three weeks now and he was calling to get back together. She states she was tired of him calling so she ignored the rest of his calls for the remainder of the day. She believes because she ignored his calls, he came over and broke in to see if she was at home since no items were missing.

## **Criminal Damaging** **(2909.06)**

On 2/6/18, the victim reported an unknown person(s) entered her residence without permission by breaking a side door window, accessing the dead bolt on the inside and unlocking it to gain entry into the residence.

The victim stated she left early in the morning on February 5, 2018 at approximately 0600 AM and returned on February 6, 2018 at 0230 am. She states when she entered the residence and the kitchen she noticed the side security light was out, which

## **Breaking & Entering (2911.13)**

Officers were dispatched to Tom's Drive Thru for a Breaking and Entering that had occurred overnight. Upon arrival PO Miller was greeted a store employee, who arrived to work and found the front exit only glass door broken out. The employee was able to access the stores security cameras for review.

At approximately 0205 a male white, medium build, wearing a gray two-tone hoodie and dark pants approached the business from the southeast. He used a piece of concrete to break the door glass and enter the building. Once inside the store the subject stole various bottles of alcohol and cigarettes before leaving through the same door. He dropped a bottle of alcohol just outside of the exit door then walked west on Galbraith.

At approximately 0417 the same male white re-entered the business through the same broken door and stole additional alcohol and cigarettes before exiting out the door. When he exited the store for the second time he proceeded to the rear of the building, going north on Gilbert.

The employee confirmed that the store alarm was set and did activate when he opened the door. However none of the motion sensors activated the alarm when the suspect was inside the store.

PO Miller processed the entry/exit door for fingerprints and was able to lift a print off the interior side of the



glass. He also processed the counter that the suspect was seen touching in the video and the bottle that was dropped outside the business. No prints were obtained from the bottle.

The employee stated that he would burn a copy of the video footage and get us a more detailed inventory of what was stolen.

### **Resisting Arrest (2921.33)**

Officers were flagged down by a complainant in reference to a juvenile who made threats to assault him, after the juvenile threw a Doctor Pepper soda bottle at the complainant's business. He pointed at the juvenile and said he is the one with head phones. PO Cole stopped and detained the subject. When PO Cole transported him to the location of the offense. he asked him to pick the bottle up and he refused. PO Cole then went to handcuff him and he tried pulling away telling PO Cole to "get off him." PO Cole was able to handcuff him and put him in the back of the cruiser.

The complainant stated when he went to confront the juvenile, the juvenile looked at him and made several threats saying "I will beat your fucking ass". He stated he felt that the

subject was going to assault him. As PO Cole was escorting the juvenile into the PD, he kept pulling away, telling PO Cole to "get off". When they got into the patrol room for processing, he tried to pull away again, and squared up his posture towards PO Cole and said, "You better get off me!" At that point PO Cole searched him and his bag and because he was acting hostile towards officers. PO Cole then decided to transport him to the juvenile detention center to process him instead. While PO Cole was transporting him, he stated if PO Cole did not have his uniform on he would "beat his ass". Officers arrested him for littering, resisting and menacing.

### **Theft (2913.02)**

PO Henn was called to Kroger for a theft report. Upon arrival, he was met by the reporter who stated a female black picked up an order for a birthday cake and a box of cupcakes from the bakery department, then exited the store, passing all points of sale, without paying for the items. The reporter gave the phone number and name which was used for the order. The reporter stated she attempted to call the number given, and a female



answered. When the reporter asked about the stolen items, the subject hung up the phone. While obtaining information for the report, the reporter received a call from a subject who was inquiring about why the reporter may have called her daughter's phone. The subject stated they believe the responsible party to be her niece. The subject did not have any further information for the subject, however, she did agree to respond to the store to pay the outstanding bill owed.

### **Burglary (2911.12)**

Officers were dispatched for an intrusion alarm. When officers arrived the rear door was kicked down. Officers searched and secured the residents. The storm door was broken and the inner door was kicked in. Officers could see foot marks on the door.

The master bedroom's bed was tossed up and a top drawer on the dresser was open. Nothing else appeared tampered with. The owner of the residence was notified by the alarm company and contacted officers to state she was in Tennessee and will not be home until Monday. She only wished for a report to be

done for her damaged door to be replaced. Officers still attempted to process the scene and were unable to get any prints.

The owner's brother came to the residence to secure the door and

stated he did not notice anything missing. He stated when his sister arrives home he will have her contact officers to notify them if anything was missing.
