ARRESTS MADE IN JUNE 2014

There were a total of **93** arrests made within the City of North College Hill in JUNE 2014.

37 of the arrests were recite arrests (the person arrested was not physically taken into custody but issued a citation and told to appear in court).

56 of the arrests were physical arrests (the person was physically taken into custody).

Of the total arrests made within the month of JUNE 2014, **42** were residents of North College Hill and **51** were non-residents.

VEHICLE CRASHES REPORTED


IN JUNE 2014

There were a total of 35 auto accidents within the City of North College Hill in JUNE 2014.

3 of these crashes involved injuries.

31 of the auto accidents were on the public roadways.

4 of the auto accidents were on private property.



TRAFFIC CITATIONS ISSUED

IN JUNE 2014

The North College Hill Mayor's Court had year-to-date receipts totaling \$103,732.08 as of JUNE 2014.



There were a total of **96** traffic citations issued within the City of North College Hill in JUNE 2014.

38 of the citations were for moving offenses (Speeding, Fail to stop at a Stop Sign, etc.)

10 of the citations were for non-moving offenses (Expired license plates, not wearing a seatbelt, etc.)

18 of the citations were for parking related offenses (Parked where prohibited by signs, etc.)

30 of the citations were written warnings (the person cited was not required to pay a fine or appear in court).



VEHICLES TOWED OR IMPOUNDED

IN JUNE 2014

There were a total of 6 vehicles either towed or impounded within the City of North College Hill in JUNE 2014.



FALSE ALARMS RECEIVED

IN JUNE 2014

There were a total of 38 false alarms received that required a response by the North College Hill Police Department in JUNE 2014.

21 of these false alarms were to businesses.



17 of these false alarms were to residences.

206 Total false alarms have been received in 2014.




The following narratives are a small sampling of the various calls for service the North College Hill Police Department routinely receives.

CALLS FOR SERVICE

Burglary (2911.12)

PO B. Jones was dispatched to Ameristop for a report of an intrusion alarm. Upon arrival it was found that the front glass window to the left of the door had been completely shattered. The left door had cracked glass near the bottom also. He requested a K9 respond to the scene and additional officers for a perimeter. The key holder was contacted and advised to respond to the store. Springfield Township's K9 responded to the scene along with additional officers from Springfield Township and Mt. Healthy. The K9 tracked to the area of Simpson Ave. and B Alley, where the track was ended.



The key holder responded to the scene, unlocked the door and turned off the alarm. He was also able to pull up the security camera footage inside and outside the store. The suspect appeared to be an older male black wearing a black coat, blue jeans, red shoes and a grey shirt on his head. A close up picture of the suspect showed that he also had facial hair and was wearing no gloves. Security footage showed the suspect use a rock to crack the glass in the window. Once the glass cracked he jumped head first through the window and climbed over an ice cream freezer to gain entry into the business. The suspect then went behind the counter and started grabbing cigarette cartons before

leaving out of the business the same way he got in.

Numerous fingerprints were lifted in the areas that the security footage showed the suspect touching. Blood was found on the ice cream freezer as well as on a shard of glass from the window. The rock used to break the window was found outside in the parking lot and was also found to have blood on it.

The store employee stated that after viewing security footage that he believes the suspect is a regular customer, but couldn't be sure. He stated the person he is thinking about lives right across the street from Ameristop in the apartments by Shollenberger Ave. Officer Brown responded to those apartments to check for additional evidence but nothing was found.

Domestic Dispute

Officers were called to Cordova Ave. for a domestic related incident. While en route, officers were updated that the female half was trying to leave the scene. Upon arrival, officers located the female in the Alley, directly across from her residence. The male half was her brother, who advised officers that she is addicted to Heroin and that she had

taken \$80.00, out of his pants pocket without his permission, which she then used to purchase Heroin. He stated that he last saw his money on 06/06/2014 around 2300 hours and that he noticed it missing this morning around 0900 hours. When he confronted his sister about the money, she immediately denied taking it and that was what started the argument between both of them.

Officers performed a query on both parties involved and it was discovered that the sister had a felony warrant for a probation violation. She was taken into custody and then transported back to the police department to await the Hamilton County Sheriff's Office, who was sending a deputy to pick her up.

Theft (2913.02)

PO Henn was dispatched to Simpson & Sterling Aves. for a theft from a vehicle report. Upon arrival, he was met by 2 victims, both of whom stated an unknown person or persons entered their locked vehicle and removed two ladies purses. The subject(s) appear



to have gained access to the vehicle by breaking out the driver side rear door glass. Victim #1 stated her purse was a red "Kate Spade" brand purse containing \$50.00 U.S. Currency, and American Express Card, other unknown credit cards, as well as the Social Security numbers for her husband and her children. Victim #2 stated her purse was a bright pink "Kate Spade" brand, containing her car/house keys, prescription glasses, unknown credit/store cards, one \$100.00 gift card, and prescription medication.

Both victims were advised to contact their credit card companies as well as their financial institutions to advise them of the theft. They were further advised a report would be on file with our department to document the incident as well as the procedure to follow for obtaining a copy of that report.

A partial latent fingerprint was recovered from the driver side rear exterior door handle. That print will be forwarded for possible identification and analysis.

Burglary (2911.12)

Officers were contacted via public service and asked to respond to the listed address ref: a burglary report.

Once on scene, officers met with the first complainant/ victim. She advised, along with victim #2, that several items were missing from their residence. The residents had gone out for the day at approximately 0815 and returned at approximately 1800 hrs. Upon return victims and witness (complainant's husband) noticed the "top lock" (dead bolt) was no longer locked. After further inspection, they found the kitchen window was open. The complainant's husband went outside to find a ladder against his truck. He stated the ladder was normally kept in the shed. According to the neighbor, the suspect was seen looking in the windows of the house at some point during the day. This information was obtained from the complainant's husband, who is also the father of the suspect and the neighbor was no longer on scene.

The father decided to drive through the area of Waltham and Betts, as the suspect has friends close and is known to frequent their residence. He located his son who was carrying two Invicta Watches (approximate value of \$750) that belonged to him. He confronted his son who gave the watches back. He



was not able to locate the remaining, missing property. Those items are listed as stolen in the report. The complainant, who is the mother of the suspect did advised that she was "done, and wanted to pursue charges" on her son. Officers checked the area and were not able to locate the suspect. Charges are pending.

Robbery/Felonious Assault (2911.02/2903.11)

The complainant/victim state that a M/B and F/B, both heavy set and wearing white t-shirts, approached her near Goodman Av. in front of Rose's. Forcibly tore her black leather purse from her shoulder and continued walking down Goodman Ave. toward Galbraith Rd. Ms. Wilson sustained a shoulder injury and was lying on the ground when other citizens passing by stopped and helped her. She was transported to

University Hospital by NCHFD Squad 78. PO Manning contacted her neighbor, who stated that she would go to UC and

pick her up and take care of notifications. Her personal property, a walker and bag of groceries was taken for safe keeping and will be returned to her by me.

Domestic Violence/Assault (2919.25/2903.13)

Officer were dispatched to investigate unknown trouble, a female was heard screaming in the background. Upon arrival officers located an SUV parked in the roadway on Bobolink Dr. The female driver stated that her ex-boyfriend and father of her unborn child had assaulted her. She stated that she was dropping him off at his cousin's house on Bobolink Dr. She stated that when she stopped the car a verbal argument ensued with the highly intoxicated suspect. She stated that he became angry and leaned across the front of the car and elbowed her in the head. She states that he then exited the vehicle and ran around to the driver's side of the car and began wrestling with her to attempt to pull her out of the vehicle.

She stated that she had five children in the car at this time. One of the children was standing on the driver's side back seat yelling at him to stop hurting her mama. The victim states that he reached into the partially



opened window and smacked the 10 year old in the face and told her to "Shut Up!".

He then walked away towards the residence and walked into the backyard area.

When officers arrived on the scene, the suspect was observed jumping fences 2 houses down and running North through the backyards.

A warrant was entered on suspect for Domestic Violence on the ex-girlfriend and Assault on 10 year old.

Theft From Vehicle **(2913.02)**

A complainant came to NCHPD to report that someone broke into his car and removed his back pack,



containing a game boy system and some games without his permission. He said that he doesn't know if the vehicle was left unlocked or if someone picked the lock, however no damage was done to the vehicle. The complainant advised that he will work on getting Officers the serial number on the

game boy, so that we may enter it as stolen into RCIC.

Criminal Mischief **(2909.07)**

Officers were dispatched for a report of a vehicle tampering in progress. Officers were updated that there were three subjects involved and all were described as male blacks, 15-18 years of age. One subject was wearing a yellow shirt and blue jeans; another was wearing a black hat, white shirt, and was wearing a backpack. The third suspect was wearing blue jeans and a striped shirt.

When officers arrived they observed the three subjects as described from the dispatch. The subject wearing a backpack was actively inside a white vehicle, while the other two subjects stood on the sidewalk as "lookouts". Officers approached on foot and upon sight of police all three subjects ran through the rear yards towards Centerridge. Officers gave chase but were unable to catch the subjects.

It was determined later that the three subjects had entered three separate vehicles in the area. The owner of each vehicle was located

and reported no items to be missing. All the vehicles were unlocked at the time of offense.

know the suspects name, and only knows him as an acquaintance. She also stated that she saw the victim at a bar earlier that night and left with him after closing.

Assault (2903.13)

On 6/29/14 at 3:14 AM, PO Smith was dispatched to McDonald's/Shell for an assault in progress. Upon arrival, he located the victim and suspect vehicles. He made contact with the victim. The victim stated that he was sitting in the drive through at McDonald's, when he noticed a black male, approximately 20 years of age, exit the vehicle, and walk towards the front of the business. The victim then stated that the suspect approached his vehicle, said "back off motherfucker", and then struck him in the face. The victim then stated the suspect briefly returned to the back seat of the Scion he was a passenger in, and then exited the vehicle before police arrived on scene. The victim described the male/black suspect as 6 feet tall, and approximately 180 lbs. He stated that he was wearing a white t-shirt.



After speaking with the Scion driver, PO Smith made contact with the Shell Gas Station attendant, who also stated that the suspect was a male/black wearing a white V-neck t-shirt, with a tattoo across his chest. He then stated that he witnessed the suspect strike the victim, return to the Scion, then leave the scene shortly thereafter. The attendant also stated that a manager would be available on Monday, 6/30/14 to assist in reviewing the surveillance footage.

After speaking with the victim, PO Smith made contact with the driver of the Scion. She stated that she did not
