# ARRESTS MADE IN JULY 2014

There were a total of 79 arrests made within the City of North College Hill in JULY 2014.

35 of the arrests were recite arrests (the person arrested was not physically taken into custody but issued a citation and told to appear in court).

44 of the arrests were physical arrests (the person was physically taken into custody).

Of the total arrests made within the month of JULY 2014, 31 were residents of North College Hill and 39 were non-residents.


# VEHICLE CRASHES REPORTED IN JULY 2014

There were a total of 26 auto accidents within the City of North College Hill in JULY 2014.

4 of these crashes involved injuries.

18 of the auto accidents were on the public roadways.

8 of the auto accidents were on private property.



# TRAFFIC CITATIONS ISSUED

## IN JULY 2014

The North College Hill Mayor's Court had year-to-date receipts totaling \$116,737.08 as of JULY 2014.



There were a total of 70 traffic citations issued within the City of North College Hill in JULY 2014.

21 of the citations were for moving offenses (Speeding, Fail to stop at a Stop Sign, etc.)

8 of the citations were for non-moving offenses (Expired license plates, not wearing a seatbelt, etc.)

16 of the citations were for parking related offenses (Parked where prohibited by signs, etc.)

25 of the citations were written warnings (the person cited was not required to pay a fine or appear in court).



# VEHICLES TOWED OR IMPOUNDED

## IN JULY 2014

There were a total of 9 vehicles either towed or impounded within the City of North College Hill in JULY 2014.



# FALSE ALARMS RECEIVED

## IN JULY 2014

There were a total of 28 false alarms received that required a response by the North College Hill Police Department in JULY 2014.

8 of these false alarms were to businesses.



20 of these false alarms were to residences.

234 Total false alarms have been received in 2014.



The following narratives are a small sampling of the various calls for service the North College Hill Police Department routinely receives.

## CALLS FOR SERVICE

### Disorderly Conduct/Open Container (2917.11/4301.62)

Officers were dispatched to investigate for a male black, wearing rolled up pants, jumping in front of vehicles and looking into the windows. Suspect was also seen climbing a telephone pole and carrying a metal pipe. Per the witness, the subject had jumped in front of his car while travelling north on Laboiteaux Ave. The witness also observed the suspect jump in front of another vehicle and sit down in the middle of the road.



The suspect was located at the intersection of Laboiteaux Ave. and Acorn Dr. He was carrying an open can of Bud Light Lime and a "Swiffer" duster pole. When asked about the pole, the suspect replied that he was helping to clean the streets. When asked about jumping in front of moving vehicles, he replied, he did jump in front of a vehicle because they were speeding and he wanted to slow them down. Subject was cited for DC and open container.

## Robbery (2911.02)

Sgt. Ferguson and PO Lasonczyk were dispatched to Kroger, 7132 Hamilton Ave. for a report of a street robbery that had just occurred. Det. Fritz, Chief Foust and officers from Mt. Healthy and Colerain Township also responded to the area. The suspect was described as a male black wearing a black t-shirt and black shorts. Taken in the offense was the victim's orange purse. The suspect was last seen running southbound through the parking lot of Perkin's.

Sgt. Ferguson went through the lot of Perkin's and PO Lasonczyk located the victim in the lot of Kroger. The victim stated she was loading her groceries in the back of her Toyota Rav4 when she saw the suspect walking along the edge of the parking lot. When the victim saw him, she grabbed her purse and put it in the back of her vehicle. She then saw the suspect walking towards her. The suspect then pushed her into the back of her vehicle, grabbed the purse, and ran through Perkin's Lot. He then climbed a fence and ran through the yards on Southridge Ln.



Workers at the Clovernook Center for the Blind reported the suspect had run through their parking lot and into the woods behind their property, towards Pies Park. The area was checked and Code Enforcement Officer John Fulmer saw a subject matching the description running through Pies Park behind the North College Hill City Center. A perimeter was set and the suspect was seen in the lot of 1544 W. Galbraith Rd. He was taken into custody and was verbally advised of his Miranda Rights by Sgt. Ferguson. The subject later advised PO David Scott (MT. Healthy PD) that he would take PO Scott to the area where he "ditched" the purse. PO Scott located the purse on the side of 1541 Southridge Ln. Det. Fritz responded to that location while PO Scott transported the suspect to the North College Hill PD. Det. Fritz photographed the purse and the contents and brought them back to the PD. The victim was there and determined the only items still missing from the purse, that she could think of, was her iPhone 5S and approximately \$55 to \$58.00 cash.

## **Burglary (2911.12)**

The victim left for work around 0700 and returned at approximately 1730 to find her residence burglarized. Suspect entered via the front window and left through the front door. Taken without permission was a Sony 32" TV, Hienes 42" TV and an X-Box. Total value for items listed is \$1260.00. Victim stated she has not had anyone over in quite some time and did not know who could have commented the offense. She was advised to check with local pawn shops to possible locate item and provide serial numbers so the equipment could be entered.

## **Robbery (2911.01)**

The victim's said that as they were walking past the NCH Bakery on Galbraith they walked past a group of 3-4 males and 2-3 females. They said that the males in the group tried to talk to them and they kept walking minding their own business. They said that is when three males told them that they had a gun and that they needed to give up everything that they had. The victim's both



said that the girls in the group told them to run, so both of the victim's took off running, however it was in different directions. One victim ran past the police department towards the school and was chased by one of the suspects, who was trying to beat him up and rob him still. The other victim ran East on Galbraith towards McDonald's. Two of the suspect's ran after him trying to attack and rob him.

Officers were dispatched to the area and located multiple subjects running. When ordered to stop none of the subjects complied. Officer Meyer from Mt. Healthy was chasing one suspect near Hamilton and Bising and eventually Springfield Twp. Police officers caught him running in the area of Simpson and Galbraith.

Sgt. Schrand located two other subjects in the area of Walgreens and ordered them to stop. One subject was ordered to stop and he refused. He also continued to put his hands in his pockets like he was reaching for a gun. Sgt. Schrand told him that he was under arrest and he continued to run. He ran down Claretta into North Creek Apartments and across Galbraith where he was captured by Springfield Twp. Police. Sgt. Schrand then located 2 other

subjects, who had put back on their shirts and walk quickly into Burger King. Sgt. Schrand recognized them as subjects running from him at Walgreens, also, after they were ordered to stop. They were taken into custody there. All of the subjects were transported back to the police department.

Three of the subjects were positively identified by the victim's as the suspects that said they had a gun and tried to rob them. Neither victim recognized one of the suspects as a party involved in the robbery, however he was with them when it happened and refused commands from several officers to stop.

Three of the suspects were charged with attempted aggravated robbery and obstructing official business. The other suspect was charged with obstructing official business and resisting arrest. All subjects were transported to juvenile detention center.

## **Assault (2903.13)**

On July 6th 2014 around 2300, the victim walked into NCHPD and reported an assault. The assault occurred at/around 0030-0045 the morning of July 6th 2014. The victim stated that she was at the suspect's

house with her sister in law. An argument started between the suspect and her boyfriend. The victim did not want to get involved so she tried to leave in her own vehicle. As



she was trying to leave, the suspect made her way over towards her vehicle

and was becoming verbally threatening and then lifted her foot and kicked the car door. The car door closed on the victim's left leg. The victim continued to leave and then made her way to the ER at Christ. She has contusions to her left ankle and left lower leg.

## **Criminal Damaging** **(2909.06)**

The victim stated the relationship between her and the suspect had ended the other day. The victim stated she was living with suspect in Forest Park when the relationship was ending. She stated the suspect made a comment to her that if she does not return the cell phone to her that she will do something stupid. This comment concerned the victim, so she removed her motor scooter

from the suspect's garage. She felt the suspect would do something to the motor scooter when she was not there.

The victim stated she moved back into Four Worlds Apartments. She stated on 7-6-14, when she came out to her car she did not notice anything wrong. She stated she started her car and drove to the gas station. When she opened the gas tank lid she saw the area around the gas spout was full of sugar. She stated she drove back to the apartment and saw a small mound of sugar on the ground where her car was parked. The victim stated the only person that she could think of who would do this to her was the suspect.

PO Palmisano checked around the parking lot and did not see any other signs of sugar by any other car. He also looked and there are no cameras covering the parking lots.

## **Theft (2913.02)**

PO Henn was called to Kroger for a theft that had just occurred. Upon arrival, he was met by the store manager who stated an unknown male black entered the front of the store and removed two boxed patio furniture sets without paying for the items. The manager states the

incident was actually observed by the night manager, who has since left for the day. PO Henn spoke with another employee who states she observed the boxed patio sets in a shopping cart in the front breezeway of the store when she came in this morning at 0500. It is unknown who may have placed the items in the cart overnight. PO Henn was able to view the video surveillance which showed a male black exiting the west doors of the store, pushing a shopping cart containing two large boxes. The male



pushed the cart toward the middle of the parking lot and stopped. The male subject

appears to have looked around for a short time, then pushed the cart toward the eastern most end of the lot and loaded the boxes in an older model Oldsmobile 4 door, gray or silver in color. That vehicle then traveled south through the lot, presumably exiting onto Hamilton Ave from the southern driveway. It is unknown the direction of travel from the lot. PO Henn was provided with a possible license plate number, however the tag given returned to a 2014 Toyota. The registered address was on Chesswood Ln. in Colerain

Twp. PO Henn responded to that address and did locate a silver Toyota with both tags attached. It is believed the tag provided is inaccurate.

The manager was advised a report would be on file with our department to document the incident as well as the procedure to follow for obtaining a copy of that report.

## **Aggravated Burglary** **(2911.11)**

Officers were dispatched to a home invasion robbery which had occurred approximately ten minutes prior. Upon arrival they found the entry door to the building, a four family apartment building, which is supposed to be a secured building with the common entrance door



remaining locked. The common entry was found standing ajar with nothing propping it open.

Officers located the victims on the second floor of the apartment building, inside the open door of unit #4. They stated that they were inside their apartment watching television,

when two subjects, one of which was armed with a .22 Cal semi auto pistol, entered their apartment and ordered them to the ground.

Once on the ground the subjects demanded to know "Where the weed was". The victims stated that that they had no weed. The subjects then rifled the victim's pockets and removed their wallets and a cell phone, then fled the apartment on foot. The subjects did not advance further into the apartment then the main entry area. They did not touch anything within the apartment or the door.

The victim's admitted to smoking marijuana on occasion, the odor of burnt marijuana was strong in the apartment. They denied ever having any quantity of marijuana, maintaining that they only kept a personal use amount on hand within the apartment. The victims stated that the door to unit #4 was shut but not latched at the time of the robbery and was pushed open with forearm of one of the subjects.

Officers set up a perimeter in the area and Springfield Township's canine responded but was unable to pick up a track. Officers were unable to locate the subjects in the area.

## Aggravated Menacing (2903.21)

On 7/18/14 at 6:50 PM, officers were dispatched to De Armand Ave to investigate a subject who brandished a weapon at two juveniles. The m/b juveniles stated that they were standing on the sidewalk next to the residence, and a black, male, wearing a blue jacket, approached them, said "back up before I shoot y'all", then displayed a black firearm. The victims then stated that the suspect fled the scene running westbound on De Armand. The victims described the suspect as light skinned, approximately 15 to 19 years of age. The victims also stated that the suspect was accompanied by a black, female, dark complexion, wearing a purple jacket. Officers searched the area but were unable to locate the suspect.

## Theft from a Vehicle (2913.02)

PO Brown responded for a report of a theft from a motor vehicle. Upon arrival, he spoke with the complainant, who stated that sometime between the hours of 0130 hrs. and 0620 hrs. on 07/22/14, person(s) unknown had entered his two vehicles in the driveway and his

daughter's vehicle that was parked in the street. He added that the doors to all of the vehicles were unlocked. He stated that none of the vehicles were damaged and only appeared that the glove boxes were rifled through. The complainant advised that one of the vehicles in his driveway, a 2008 Toyota RAV4, had been rifled through to the point that the center console was opened and a Tom Tom GPS unit in a red case was missing.

At that time, the GPS unit had been the only item

missing from the three vehicles. The model and serial number was obtained for the GPS and was entered into RCIC.
