ARRESTS MADE IN FEBRUARY 2016

There were a total of 104 arrests made within the City of North College Hill in FEBRUARY 2016.

67 of the arrests were recite arrests (the person arrested was not physically taken into custody but issued a citation and told to appear in court).

37 of the arrests were physical arrests (the person was physically taken into custody).

Of the total arrests made within the month of FEBRUARY 2016, 49 were residents of North College Hill and 55 were non-residents.

IN FEBRUARY 2016


There were a total of **37** auto accidents within the City of North College Hill in FEBRUARY 2016.

2 - of these crashes involved injuries.

22 - of the auto accidents were on public roadways.

6 - of the auto accidents were on private property.

7 - of the auto accidents were Hit/Skip related.



TRAFFIC CITATIONS ISSUED

IN FEBRUARY 2016

The North College Hill Mayor's Court had year-to-date receipts totaling \$27,281.00 as of FEBRUARY 2016.



There were a total of **97** traffic citations issued within the City of North College Hill in FEBRUARY 2016.

27 of the citations were for moving offenses (OVI, Speeding, Fail to Obey a Stop Sign, etc.)

21 of the citations were for non-moving offenses (Expired license plates, not wearing a seatbelt, etc.)

6 of the citations were for parking related offenses (Parked where prohibited by signs, etc.)

43 of the citations were written warnings (the person cited was not required to pay a fine or appear in court).



VEHICLES TOWED OR IMPOUNDED IN FEBRUARY 2016

There were a total of 8 vehicles either towed or impounded within the City of North College Hill in FEBRUARY 2016. (These vehicles were towed or impounded at the request of the police department)



FALSE ALARMS RECEIVED IN FEBRUARY 2016

There were a total of 25 false alarms received that required a response by the North College Hill Police Department in FEBRUARY 2016.

9 of these false alarms were to businesses.



16 of these false alarms were to residences.

58 Total false alarms have been received in 2016.



The following narratives are a small sampling of the various calls for service the North College Hill Police Department routinely receives.

CALLS FOR SERVICE

Burglary (2911.12)

Officer Six was dispatched to Parrish Avenue, to see a complainant for a burglary report. The victim stated that when she returned home, her television was missing. The television was a Samsung, 55" valued at \$800. According to the victim, the last time the television was seen at the residence was at approximately 9:40 am today's date. The victim returned home at approximately 2:30 pm today's date. The unknown suspect appeared to have entered and left via the front door. The front



door was only locked on the bottom (Lock inside the door knob) and did not have the dead bolt engaged. The bottom lock also does not protrude through a striker plate, allowing a gentle nudge to easily open the door. The door's surface would not permit fingerprinting nor would the area where the television was kept. Investigation is pending.

Criminal Damaging (2909.06)

On 2/8/15 at approximately 12:28 AM, PO Smith was dispatched to Dearmand Ave to investigate damage to a window on the property. Upon arrival, PO Smith made contact with the

Complainant. He stated that he was watching the Super Bowl in his living room at approximately 7 PM and heard a crashing sound from the side of the house. The complainant then stated that he went outside and discovered glass breakage to the southwest window of the residence. PO Smith inspected the window from the outside of the residence, and broken glass was present inside the pane, as well as on the grass. A small, 1 inch diameter mark was also observed on the bottom, right side of the window. No foreign object was located in the area.

Theft (2913.02)

The complainant and her mother responded to the North College Hill PD to report that a M/W subject had taken the Chromebook Computer assigned to her by the High School. This occurred in late November, 2015. She stated she was placing fliers in the hallway, near her locker and she put the computer on the floor. When she turned around, the computer was gone. She did report this to the office immediately. School personnel checked the cameras, but were unable to see who took the computer.



A report was generated for documentation purposes.

Domestic Violence/Obstructing Official Business (2919.25/2921.31)

Officers were called to Bobolink Dr. for a report of a boyfriend assaulting the mother of the complainant, and the male subject had a gun in his hand. PO Cole arrived on scene and could hear a female yelling in the house. He walked up to a window on the south side of the house. The blinds were shut but he was able to see a female standing behind a bed. PO Cole saw a male subject walk up to the female, yelling at her. PO Cole could not see male's hands to determine if he had a weapon or not.

PO Jones arrived and after several commands for the male to come to the door, PO Jones made the decision to kick the door down. PO Cole started to walk into the house and spotted a male subject run into the back bedroom. He called for the female's two older children to come towards him. The oldest daughter told him the male

subject was not letting her mom leave the room and she was afraid he was going to shoot her. PO's Cole and Jones kept yelling commands for the male subject to step out of the room. He yelled at the officers to come into the room. After Multiple commands, the male subject allowed the female to leave the room. The male then walked out of the bedroom with his hands up. Officers were able to safely bring the male into custody.

While searching the room officers noticed the bed was slanted and the blankets were tossed. When officers lifted the mattress, they found a loaded revolver handgun. The female was not positive if the male had the gun in his hand. She stated he had a rag in his hand, waiving it around, saying he was going to shoot her. One of the daughters said he had the gun in his hand and she was scared. The male subject said he did not have the gun in his hands. The male was charged Domestic Violence and Obstructing Official Business.



handgun had been stolen from her vehicle overnight. PO Brown asked her if her vehicle had been locked and she said that it was locked. There was no damage on her vehicle observed. The complainant stated that her vehicle was possibly unlocked when she was cleaning out her purse last night and may have accidentally activated the key FOB belonging to her vehicle.

The complainant advised that when she went out to her car to go to work this morning, she noticed that the driver's door was ajar and her center console was open. She stated that she forgot to remove her .25 cal chrome semi-auto pistol from the center console and found that it was gone. She also added that nothing else had been taken. She said she's had the pistol for 20 years and had no documentation for the gun. PO Brown advised that with no model or serial number, it would be impossible to enter the item into our system. No suspects are known at this time.

Theft (2913.02)

PO Brown responded to Catalpa for a report of theft from a motor vehicle. Upon arrival, he met with the complainant, who stated that a

Criminal Damaging **(2909.06)**

PO Six was dispatched to Bising Ave. to see a complainant regarding criminal damage done to his work vehicle. The complainant was driving on Bising Avenue when his window "exploded." The complainant was heading west at the time. The window appeared to be shot out by a bb or pellet. No suspect(s) were found at the time of report.

Theft of an Auto **(2913.02)**

On 2/1/16 at 11:38 PM, PO Smith was dispatched to Four Worlds drive to see a complainant reference a stolen motor vehicle. Upon arrival on scene, contact was made with the complainant. The complainant stated that she parked her daughter's silver, 2003 Honda Civic in the parking lot of Four Worlds Apartments at approximately 2:55 PM on 2/1/16. The complainant then stated that upon returning to the parking lot, she discovered that the vehicle was stolen. Per the complainant, the vehicle was locked, and all of the windows were rolled up. The complainant also stated that only she

and her daughter have access to the vehicle.

Fraudulent Check

A complainant responded to the North College Hill PD to report that subject(s) unknown did on January 21, 2016, deposit a check into the ATM at Huntington Bank in the amount of \$3,800.00. The check was issued from Cardinal Motors (4805 Dixie Hwy, Fairfield, OH 45014) and was made payable to the complainant. The complainant stated she has never received a check from Cardinal Motors, nor is she due a check from Cardinal Motors. The complainant stated this check has turned out to be fraudulent, and now she is unable to bank with anyone as this was reported against her. She does not know who deposited this check, nor why her name was used.



Domestic Violence (2919.25)

Officer Six responded to 1706 Centerridge Avenue for a report of a physical domestic. Officers were updated the suspect, a 17 male, was

no longer on scene and was last seen walking north on Hamilton Avenue. Officers Elston and Wilber responded to this area to check for the suspect. The victim is the juvenile's mother. She stated her son had pushed her several times during an argument. She was not injured, however, the complainant stated she wished to pursue charges of Domestic Violence against her son. Officers were not able to locate the suspect in the area and a warrant was filed for his arrest.



who stated that on or about the above listed time, two (2) M/B subjects wearing dark clothing approached him as he was walking towards Good Brothers Bar. Upon making contact one of the subjects pulled a dark colored weapon, believed to be a semi-automatic possibly a .40 and or .45 caliber and made the victim walk east bound on Sundale Ave. to a dark area, where they took his cell phone, wallet, \$60.00 US Currency, miscellaneous credit cards, and the keys to his Chrysler 200. The victim contacted his mother, who had a second set of keys, and she brought them to the victim so he could retrieve his vehicle. Upon further investigation it was discovered that the offense had occurred some 60 minutes earlier. The victim was now calm and stated he was happy to be alive.

Aggravated Robbery **(2911.01)**

Officers responded to the area Savannah Ave. for a report of an armed street robbery. Upon arrival, PO Shumate met the complainant,
