# **ARRESTS MADE IN SEPTEMBER 2016**

There were a total of **75** arrests made within the City of North College Hill in SEPTEMBER 2016.

**45** of the arrests were recite arrests (the person arrested was not physically taken into custody but issued a citation and told to appear in court).

**30** of the arrests were physical arrests (the person was physically taken into custody).

Of the total arrests made within the month of SEPTEMBER 2016, **32** were residents of North College Hill and **43** were non-residents.

## **IN SEPTEMBER 2016**


There were a total of **50** auto accidents within the City of North College Hill in SEPTEMBER 2016.

**2** - of these crashes involved injuries.

**24** - of the auto accidents were on public roadways.

**8** - of the auto accidents were on private property.

**16** - of the auto accidents were Hit/Skip related.



# TRAFFIC CITATIONS ISSUED

## IN SEPTEMBER 2016

The North College Hill Mayor's Court had year-to-date receipts totaling \$95,757.00 as of SEPTEMBER 2016.



There were a total of **103** traffic citations issued within the City of North College Hill in SEPTEMBER 2016.

**44** of the citations were for moving offenses (OVI, Speeding, Fail to Obey a Stop Sign, etc.)

**17** of the citations were for non-moving offenses (Expired license plates, not wearing a seatbelt, etc.)

15 of the citations were for parking related offenses  
(Parked where prohibited by signs, etc.)

27 of the citations were written warnings (the person  
cited was not required to pay a fine or appear in  
court).



# VEHICLES TOWED OR IMPOUNDED IN SEPTEMBER 2016

There were a total of 1 vehicles either towed or impounded within the City of North College Hill in SEPTEMBER 2016. (These vehicles were towed or impounded at the request of the police department)



# FALSE ALARMS RECEIVED IN SEPTEMBER 2016

There were a total of 26 false alarms received that required a response by the North College Hill Police Department in SEPTEMBER 2016.



10 of these false alarms were to businesses.

16 of these false alarms were to residences.

245 Total false alarms have been received in 2016.



The following narratives are a small sampling of the various calls for service the North College Hill Police Department routinely receives.

## **CALLS FOR SERVICE**

### **Assault (2903.13)**

Officers responded for a family member that was creating a disturbance and had pushed and hit another family member while extended family gathered after a funeral. The complainant advised she was in the hallway of the home and had asked her uncle to leave due to his rude behavior and demeanor. She advised he became verbally and physically confrontational and pushed and grabbed her causing a scratch to the back of her right arm. She advised, others in the home at the time assisted the confrontational male outside where he went to his vehicle and he left



the area. Police and Life Squad were called for the female and medical care was refused. Officers were advised the male was an ongoing patient of psychiatric care and was off of his medications and drinking beer today. They continued to advise they were concerned about his mental state and were not sure what he was capable of due to the death of his mother and his being off his medication and drinking today. They believed he was responding back to his home and did not think it was safe for him to be driving. Officers did check the area for him and his vehicle and were unable to locate him. Officers also called the Hamilton County Communications

Center and requested a broadcast be put out over the police radios advising to stop and check on the wellbeing of him if anyone made contact with him. The complainant advised they just wanted him to get help and to be sure he was in a safe place and being cared for.

## **Aggravated Menacing (2903.21)**

On 9/3/16 at 11:24 pm, Officers were dispatched to Pinoak Dr. to investigate a male being threatened by a person armed with a baseball bat. Upon arrival, contact was made with the Complainant. He stated that approximately five minutes prior to dispatch, a male who he knows as Chad, came into the basement of his residence, put a baseball bat near his head, and threatened to beat him up. The Complainant then stated that Chad fled the residence in an unknown direction of travel.



The Complainant described Chad as a large build white male, approximately 25 years of age, with a beard. Mr. Duke stated that Chad was wearing a black shirt. He then advised that he knew where Chad resides.

At approximately 11:35 pm, the Complainant was transported to Pippin Rd, the location where the complainant advised Chad resides. Officers attempted to make contact with Chad, but were unsuccessful. The Complainant was advised to contact police if he obtains more detailed information on the suspect.

## **Telecommunications Harassment (2917.21)**

On 09/08/2016 @ 1658 hours, PO Kodish responded to Clovernook Ave for a harassment / trespassing report. Upon arrival, he was met by the complainant and her parents. He was advised by the complainant that she had recently ended a relationship with her ex-boyfriend and that since the breakup he has been constantly calling her residence and even showing up there on numerous occasions.

On today's date, the male subject arrived at the residence and was trying to make contact with the complainant so that he could talk to her about their relationship. The complainant also stated that he had taken her cell phone and was refusing

to give it back to her. The complainant's parents advised the male subject that he was no longer welcome there and that he needed to leave or they would call police. While the police were being called, he voluntarily left the residence and drove away in his vehicle but had refused to return the complainant's cell phone to her. After leaving the scene, the male subject began constantly calling the residence in an effort to make contact with the complainant.

While PO Kodish was on scene gathering the information for the report, the male called the residence. The phone was answered by the complainant and it was put on speaker for everyone to hear. She asked him to return her cell phone and he refused to do so. At that moment, PO Kodish identified himself to the male and advised him that he needed to return the cell phone or he would be charged with theft. He advised PO Kodish that he didn't have the cell phone and that he had placed it on the complainant's vehicle, which was parked in the driveway, before he had left the area.

The cell phone was retrieved by the complainant's parents while PO

Kodish continued a conversation with the male on the phone. PO Kodish advised him that he was no longer permitted at the residence and that he was to cease and desist his constant phone calls to the residence.

PO Kodish provided the complainant with information on how to file a protection order and she was advised that a report would be generated for documentation purposes.

## **Theft (2913.02)**

Officers responded to Walgreens for a report of a male subject selecting a bottle of Advil, valued at \$11.49, removed the bottle from the package and placed the bottle in his left pocket. The subject went to the front register to pay for a beverage, but did not pay for the Advil. PO Brown stopped the subject and escorted him to the office. PO Brown asked him where the pills were and he said they were in his front pocket. PO Brown retrieved them and he asked if he could pay for them. The management requested prosecution. The subject was cited to municipal court and released on scene. Subject



was also advised that he was now trespassed from this location.

## **Vandalism (2909.05)**

Officer Six and Kilgore responded to the lot behind Dollar General for a Criminal Damage report. Officers met with the complainant, who is a driver for Red Bird Transportation. He and another driver often park behind Dollar General as it is closer to their homes. When the complainant went to pick up his tractor and trailer to leave, he observed it leaning to one side. As he approached the passenger side he could readily see damage to several tires. Upon further inspection, he noticed all the tires on the passenger side had damage. The tires appeared to have been stabbed with an ice pick. This left damage totaling approximately \$3300.



On the listed date and time, Colerain Twp. officers were dispatched to Springdale Rd. for a person stabbed. When they arrived they found the victim with a single puncture hole to the center of his back. After talking with the victim, they determined that the assault occurred on Goodman near Savannah in our jurisdiction. We were notified of the incident and advised that the victim was transported by squad to the hospital.

PO Miller responded to the hospital and spoke with the victim and his girlfriend, who was present when the stabbing occurred. The victim stated that he and his girlfriend were walking eastbound on Goodman when he was stabbed in the back by a known suspect. The victim stated that he didn't see suspect until he was stabbed. After being stabbed, the victim fled on foot, east on Goodman and then north on Savannah. The victim said that the suspect chased him for a while but ultimately gave up and ran back to his house.

## **Felonious Assault (2903.11)**

The victim's girlfriend said she didn't move after the assault and when the suspect returned from chasing the victim, she noticed that he was carrying a knife in his hand. She said that the suspect approached her while holding the knife and threatened her. When asked what the suspect said she was unable to give specific statements. She said an older male black and a younger female black came out on the porch of a house on Goodman and was yelling at the suspect to stop, it's not worth it. The suspect heeded their warning and walked up to the house. The girlfriend then walked down the street and found the victim on Savannah near Galbraith Rd.



The victim stated that a person he knows but is unsure of his name drove by and offered to give him a ride. He and his girlfriend were then transported to her house in Colerain where they called the police.

## **Aggravated Robbery** **(2911.01)**

Colerain Township Police were called to the Speedway Gas Station at the corner of West Galbraith Road and Pippin Rd. for an assault that just

occurred. Come to find out, the assault was actually a robbery and it happened in the parking lot of the Iron Woods Apts. in North College Hill. The victim explained to PO Elston that he was with his girlfriend.

He said that they were pulling into the Iron Woods Apt. Complex to drop off kids at his girlfriend's daughter's house. He said that they parked, and as they did, a known suspect came out of nowhere and unlocked the car and opened it. The suspect started beating/hitting the victim on the head and on the back with a brick. The victim then turned his back to take cover and prevent the suspect from pulling him out of the car. When he turned his back, the suspect took his wallet out of his pocket.

The victim then left the scene and went to the Speedway in Colerain, where the police were then called. The victim and his girlfriend filled out voluntary witness statements and the victim stated he wanted to press charges. PO Elston also advised the victim how to obtain a protection order due to the suspect continuing to send threatening texts and voice mails.

## Theft from a Vehicle (2913.02)

The complainant called and advised that subject(s) unknown did enter her vehicle and take her Air Jordan gym shoes, which were left on the front passenger's side. She



stated she went to McDonald's with her son at approximately 2300 hours and returned to the apartment complex, parking the vehicle in the lot. She stated she always hits the lock button on her vehicle so she is not sure how the subject(s) gained entry.
