ARRESTS MADE IN SEPTEMBER 2017

There were a total of **72** arrests made within the City of North College Hill in SEPTEMBER 2017.

40 of the arrests were recite arrests (the person arrested was not physically taken into custody but issued a citation and told to appear in court).

32 of the arrests were physical arrests (the person was physically taken into custody).

Of the total arrests made within the month of SEPTEMBER 2017, **25** were residents of North College Hill and **47** were non-residents.

VEHICLE CRASHES REPORTED IN SEPTEMBER 2017

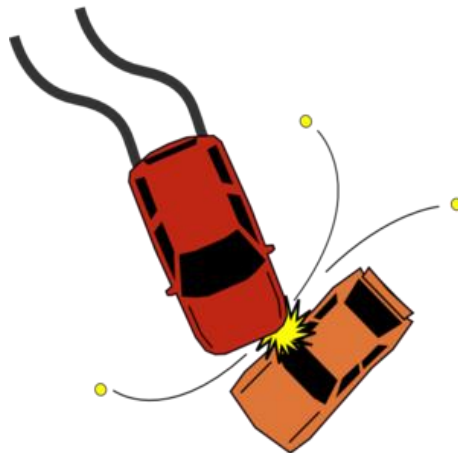
There were a total of 38 auto accidents within the City of North College Hill in SEPTEMBER 2017.

4 - of these crashes involved injuries.

19 - of the auto accidents were on public roadways.

8 - of the auto accidents were on private property.

7 - of the auto accidents were Hit/Skip related.



TRAFFIC CITATIONS ISSUED

IN SEPTEMBER 2017

The North College Hill Mayor's Court had year-to-date receipts totaling \$91,617.16 as of SEPTEMBER 2017.



There were a total of **109** traffic citations issued within the City of North College Hill in SEPTEMBER 2017.

66 of the citations were for moving offenses (OVI, Speeding, Fail to Obey a Stop Sign, etc.)

12 of the citations were for non-moving offenses (Expired license plates, not wearing a seatbelt, etc.)

6 of the citations were for parking related offenses
(Parked where prohibited by signs, etc.)

25 of the citations were written warnings (the person
cited was not required to pay a fine or appear in
court).



VEHICLES TOWED OR IMPOUNDED IN SEPTEMBER 2017

There were a total of 17 vehicles either towed or impounded within the City of North College Hill in SEPTEMBER 2017. (These vehicles were towed or impounded at the request of the police department)



FALSE ALARMS RECEIVED IN SEPTEMBER 2017

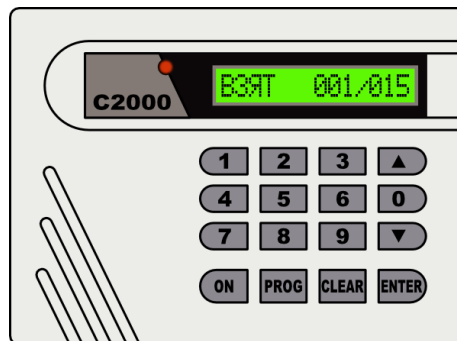
There were a total of 24 false alarms received that required a response by the North College Hill Police Department in SEPTEMBER 2017.



9 of these false alarms were to businesses.

15 of these false alarms were to residences.

233 Total false alarms have been received in 2017.



The following narratives are a small sampling of the various calls for service the North College Hill Police Department routinely receives.

CALLS FOR SERVICE

Domestic Violence (2919.25)

Officers were notified to respond to Centeridge on a reported 911 call. Upon arrival, PO Henn found the and the arrested in the front room of the residence. The victim was complaining of neck and throat pain, and trouble breathing. EMS was requested. The victim stated the suspect choked her, and when she told him she couldn't breathe, he allegedly changed his grip to apply more pressure to her throat. The victim stated the suspect was her boyfriend and they have been living together for approximately 12 years. They got into an argument over each one of

their children, neither by them, living and/or contributing to the activities in the house. The victim stated during the argument, the suspect pushed her hard to the floor, grabbed her by the neck and began choking her. She stated during this time she was losing her breath and her back was in extreme pain.



Inside the house Officers could see that the TV was broken, and that the victim was very upset. She was also showing signs of heavy breathing and redness to her neck. The North College Hill Life Squad responded to provide medical aid to the victim. She was transported to Mercy West Hospital for medical treatment.

The suspect was arrested for Domestic Violence and transported to the PD for processing.

Criminal Damaging **(2909.06)**

The complainant, a representative for Remax Reality, and a Property Manager that was at the listed house for an Open House, arrived at approximately 1300 hours and discovered there were 4 windows of the house that were broken. The house is vacant and the complainant was there to show people the house in hopes of renting or selling the house. He noticed the broken windows and called the police immediately. He also walked inside the house and checked the 1st floor and basement. No one was located inside; however, he did find a head to a golf club in the bathroom, which is where one of the broken windows was located. PO's Henn and Lasonczyk checked the entire house and found no one inside. PO Henn stated the house was fine as of 1300 hours on 9/2/2017. It is unknown at the time of the report as to who may have broken the window.



Theft (2913.02)

The listed victim came to our station to report an unknown person or persons removed a refrigerator from her front porch without her knowledge or consent. The victim states they had placed the refrigerator on the porch to clean it out, and it had been there for a few days. She was notified by her neighbor across the street that the refrigerator had been taken. The victim is not currently residing in the residence.

The victim was advised a report would be on file with our department to document the incident as well as the procedure to follow for obtaining a copy of that report.

Burglary (2911.12)

PO Wilber was dispatched for a burglary report. When he arrived, he made contact with the complainant, who stated that he came home and found some of his things missing, and his spare key gone. The victim stated that about 2 months ago, his ex-

girlfriend was kicked out of his house and she left. The complainant stated that she made comments to him that she would be back. He stated that she knows where he keeps his spare key and that's probably how she got in the house. The victim showed PO Wilber where he kept the spare key and in fact was gone. Taken was a Siroq, Remi Martin, and Bombay Gin liquor. Also taken were a blender, 210.00 in coins, and a deep fryer. DNA swabs were taken of the cabinets that were opened to get the blender and deep fryer out. The victim submitted to an exclusionary DNA swab also. The DNA will be sent to the lab.



and 1000, he was on his way to class when the suspect passed him in the hallway. The suspect then purposely crossed over towards the victim and shoved him with his shoulder.

PO Shepherd checked with Hamilton County Juvenile Clerk of Courts, and the protection order is active and has been served to both parties. She also requested School Resource

Officer Manning to help with obtaining video of the incident. P.O. Manning will attempt to obtain video and will continue the investigation.

Violation of Protection Order (2919.27)

PO Shepherd was dispatched to the PD for a complainant on station. Upon arrival, she was met by the complainant, who stated that her son is the victim of a protection order violation. The complainant stated to PO Shepherd that her son is a protected party in a juvenile protection order, protected from threats or assaults by another juvenile, who is also a student. The victim stated to his mother that this morning between the hours of 0900

Theft from a Vehicle (2913.02)

The complainant called the North College Hill Police and stated that he came home from work at 0315 hours on 9/14/2017, and when his wife left for work at 0630 hours, she noticed that the driver side window of their vehicle broken out. The complainant stated that the suspect went through his vehicle and took 2 pair of Oakley sunglasses with a total value of \$380.

Criminal Damaging **(2909.06)**

PO Henn was dispatched to Emerson Ave. for a property damage report. Upon arrival, he was met by the victim, who states an unknown person or persons damaged his 2004 Chevrolet Impala sometime overnight without his knowledge or consent. The vehicle was parked on the street in front of his residence. The vehicle did have numerous scratches along the left side, across the hood, and across the trunk lid. Some of the scratches



appear to be superficial, being able to be wiped off by hand; however a few of the scratches do appear to be down into the paint.

The victim was advised a report would be on file with our department to document the incident as well as the procedure to follow for obtaining a copy of that report.
