ARRESTS MADE IN OCTOBER 2017

There were a total of 84 arrests made within the City of North College Hill in OCTOBER 2017.

34 of the arrests were recite arrests (the person arrested was not physically taken into custody but issued a citation and told to appear in court).

50 of the arrests were physical arrests (the person was physically taken into custody).

Of the total arrests made within the month of OCTOBER 2017, 38 were residents of North College Hill and 46 were non-residents.

IN OCTOBER 2017


There were a total of **47** auto accidents within the City of North College Hill in OCTOBER 2017.

4 - of these crashes involved injuries.

23 - of the auto accidents were on public roadways.

12 - of the auto accidents were on private property.

8 - of the auto accidents were Hit/Skip related.



TRAFFIC CITATIONS ISSUED

IN OCTOBER 2017

The North College Hill Mayor's Court had year-to-date receipts totaling \$103,902.16 as of OCTOBER 2017.



There were a total of **151** traffic citations issued within the City of North College Hill in OCTOBER 2017.

82 of the citations were for moving offenses (OVI, Speeding, Fail to Obey a Stop Sign, etc.)

25 of the citations were for non-moving offenses (Expired license plates, not wearing a seatbelt, etc.)

18 of the citations were for parking related offenses (Parked where prohibited by signs, etc.)

26 of the citations were written warnings (the person cited was not required to pay a fine or appear in court).



VEHICLES TOWED OR IMPOUNDED IN OCTOBER 2017

There were a total of 12 vehicles either towed or impounded within the City of North College Hill in OCTOBER 2017. (These vehicles were towed or impounded at the request of the police department)



FALSE ALARMS RECEIVED IN OCTOBER 2017

There were a total of 32 false alarms received that required a response by the North College Hill Police Department in OCTOBER 2017.

14 of these false alarms were to businesses.



18 of these false alarms were to residences.

265 Total false alarms have been received in 2017.



The following narratives are a small sampling of the various calls for service the North College Hill Police Department routinely receives.

CALLS FOR SERVICE

Criminal Damaging **(2909.06)**

PO Henn was called for a possible attempted burglary report. Upon arrival, he was met by the victim, who states she returned home and found the front window of her residence had been broken. The victim states she did not know if anyone had attempted to gain access to the residence, and nothing inside appears to have been disturbed. On investigation, it appears some unknown object was thrown at the window, as the frame directly under the damage was dented, and the double pane glass had been



shattered. The window that was broken is the non-sliding portion of a sliding window. There was heavy ornamental grass directly under the window, and none of the grass appeared to be matted down, which would indicate someone had walked through the grass to get close to the window. The victim states she has not had any problems with anyone, and does not know why someone would want to damage her residence. She stated she has contacted the landlord, and he is going to respond to repair the window.

Burglary (2911.14)

Lt. Maus responded to Savannah Ave. for a burglary report. He arrived on scene and spoke to the victim, who stated she left for work early in the morning and when she returned home she discovered an unknown person(s) had entered her residence without her permission, by stealth and force. Specifically it was discovered that the unknown person(s) accessed the second story balcony door to the residence by removing a glass panel to the door, cutting the screen and reaching in to unlock both security devices a dead bolt and security chain.

The victim stated she left the residence at approximately 7:40 am and returned home at approximately 6:30 PM to find the unknown person(s) entered her residence. She stated she entered the residence and noticed while unlocking the front door that only the bottom lock was locked. She states when she left in the morning hours both the dead bolt and door knob lock were secured. She states when she entered the residence she immediately noticed the balcony door was ajar, the screen was cut, and a piece of the glass panel was missing. She also stated

the unknown person(s) who entered the residence opened up all her closet doors and several drawers in the kitchen, and went through the areas but did not take any items.

The victim stated she spoke to her neighbor next door and asked if they saw anyone leaving her residence during the day. She stated the neighbor stated they did not see anyone.



Theft (2913.02)

On the above date and time, the victim responded to the North College Hill Police Department to report a theft of funds from her personal bank account. Alisha states while she was attempting to make a purchase on 09/25/174 at Sam's Club her bank card was declined. Alisha states she then checked her Bank App on her cell phone to review her account balance and information. The victim states this is when she noticed two separate withdrawals from her account totaling \$906.00.

The victim contacted her bank and was advised they had attempted to contact her due to suspicious activity on her card. She states the bank has flagged her account and canceled her

debit card and since has been reissued a new card. She states the transactions were completed by unknown person(s) in Cincinnati, Ohio and she had sole possession of her card at the time of the withdrawals.

Aggravated Menacing **(2903.21)**

Officers were dispatched to the listed location for a customer threatening to shoot an employee and attempting to climb through the drive thru window. Upon arrival, the subject in question was found in the parking lot and was given verbal commands at gun point. The subject complied and was detained and identified. He was found to be unarmed.



The suspect stated that he had recently purchased food through the drive thru and had returned to complain due to his order being cold and incorrect. He stated that he parked in the parking lot and approached the drive thru on foot. He did cut in front of other customers and leaned into the window to complain about his order. He stated that he had a verbal confrontation with a female

employee, but he never threatened anybody nor was he armed.

The victim stated that while he was at the window she told him he would have to wait as she was helping other customers. She said that the suspect threw his food bag in the window and said that he wanted a refund or new food and that he would "Clap" her. The victim stated that "Clap" is slang for shoot and she believed that the suspect was going to shoot her with a gun.

The suspect did give officers verbal consent to search his vehicle and no weapon was found in the vehicle. He was transported to police station and charged with aggravated menacing and cited to NCH

Mayor's Court.

Attempted Burglary **(2923.02)**

Officers were called to Catalpa Ave. for a possible burglary in progress. On dispatch, we were advised a subject was attempting to gain entry to the residence by pushing in the air conditioner. The victim was reportedly hiding in a bedroom with her children. On

arrival, officers checked the outside perimeter of the residence. All doors and windows appeared to be secure, and the window air conditioner was in place on the west side of the residence. PO Henn requested additional information from dispatch, and was advised the victim was stating the subject was inside the residence and had pushed the air conditioner out of the window. Dispatch was advised everything was secure on the outside of the residence, and to have the victim come to the front door to meet officers. The victim eventually did come to the front door, and advised she believes the subject is her twin brother. The victim states she observed a male black wearing a red shirt and dreadlocked hair attempting to remove the air conditioner unit from the window. The victim did not know where the subject went after that. The victim states she is in an estate dispute with the suspect, and has been having problems with him for quite some time. No damage was done to the window, and no evidence the air conditioner had been tampered with. The victim was advised to seek a Civil Protection Order against her brother to keep him from harassing or contacting her.

The victim was advised a report would be on file with our department to document the incident as well as the procedure to follow for obtaining a copy of that report. She was further advised to have her landlord better secure the window where the air conditioner is installed.

Breaking & Entering **(2911.13)**

The Manager of Boost Mobile called and advised an employee he fired yesterday due to possible theft issues at another store, came in to the NCH store this morning, at approximately 0800 hours without permission to do so. This employee used his key to the store, and turned off the alarm system using his password, and allegedly took last night's bank deposit from a drawer at the front counter. The drawer where the deposit was placed is not in camera range, however, the camera did show a subject that the manager identified as the suspect, at the front counter, then exit the back entrance after setting the alarm and wiping his fingerprints off the alarm panel.



When the manager came in this morning to open the store, he discovered last night's deposit was not in the store. He made contact with the employee that closed the store last night and he told the manager the deposit was placed in the drawer at the front counter. The manager called the owner, who lives in Columbus, Ohio and the cameras were checked. It was at this time they found the suspect had come in the store without permission.

Theft of Auto (2913.02)

PO Shepherd was dispatched for a report of a stolen vehicle. Upon arrival, she was met by the victim, who stated that he was an employee of the restaurant at this location, and his vehicle was stolen from the lot. The victim stated to me that he is a delivery driver, and he had parked the vehicle to go into the restaurant to get his next delivery when an unknown male subject got into the vehicle and drove off. The keys were left in the vehicle with the vehicle running. The subject was described as a black male, unknown age, with glasses wearing a blue and white shirt and dark colored pants.



An all-county broadcast was put out for the vehicle, which the victim stated was last seen driving east on W Galbraith Rd. PO Shepherd also explained to the victim that the vehicle would be entered as stolen into RCIC and we would notify him if we are able to locate it.

Domestic Violence (2919.25)

Officers were dispatched to investigate for a female assaulted by an ex-boyfriend. Upon arrival, Lt. Petrocelli was met by the victim. She states that her ex-boyfriend had assaulted her and fled on foot through her back yard. She states that she and the suspect have two children in common, and 1 grandchild, and have lived together for years in the past. She currently does not live with him. She states that he got out of prison in June and lived with her for two weeks. She states that she had him leave when she found him using Heroin in her house.

He returned today and she asked him to leave. She states he became angry and grabbed her by the hair and punched her in the head three times with a closed fist. She states she did not need an ambulance but her head was sore. Lt. Petrocelli was unable to

see any visible injuries due to her hair being present.

A search was conducted of the area but we were unable to locate him. Less than one hour later we were called back to the residence. The victim stated that he had returned and was knocking on her door. He ran from the scene again. A search of the area conducted once again, he was not located. A warrant was issued for his arrest on Domestic Violence Charges.

Burglary (2911.12)

PO Henn was called to the listed location for an alarm. PO Henn was dispatched by our Police Clerk who received a call from the resident stating he had just received an alert from his alarm company that his side door was open. On arrival, PO Henn found glass in the side door had been broken. While checking the door, PO Henn heard a sound emanating from the front door. As he rounded the corner, he observed a M/B, appeared to be late teens to early twenties, wearing a gray hooded sweatshirt, black watch cap, and carrying a black back pack exiting the front door. PO Henn immediately drew my weapon and ordered the subject to raise his



hands. The subject did raise his hands, said something to the effect "My friend is inside", and immediately ran back inside the residence. Upon entering the residence, the rear door was found standing open. PO Henn looked out the rear door and did not observe anyone in the rear yard, so he began clearing the rest of the house. No one was found inside the residence. Other officers arrived in the area; however, no one matching the description was located in the area. Det. Fritz responded to the scene as did Cpl. Wickman (9W17) with his K9. A track was started, and tracked through the wood line behind the residence, coming out in the area of Emerson Ave. That is where the track terminated.

Clerk Hoeh made phone contact with the resident who stated he is an hour away, and could not immediately respond. After a query of a vehicle in the driveway, which returned to the resident, it was found the resident has a CCW. PO Henn requested Clerk Hoeh to ascertain if the resident has his weapons with him or if they are in the house. The resident advised he has two Glock pistols in a cabinet next to his bed, a Mossburg shotgun under the bed, and an FN Five Seven on the stairs leading to the 2nd floor.

The weapon on the stairs was located, as was the shotgun, and one Glock pistol which was laying on top of an empty gun case with another empty Glock gun case next to it. The second Glock pistol was unable to be located. At the time of this report, it is unknown what, if anything was taken from the residence.
